The Position

The position requires a high level of discipline to create results in an efficient and effective manner, with high standards for the quality of their deliverables. The work involves working with fishermen, fishing communities, NGO's, seafood industry and local authorities.

- Local project management in close coordination with the project lead in Switzerland
- Outreach and engage fishermen and fishing communities for participation in the project
- Organize meetings and workshops with local fisheries stakeholders and local government units
- Outreach and engagement with local private sector actors (seafood industry)

- Process relevant information, elaborate structured reports and closely work with development team

Who You Are

You are a Mexican citizen or resident interested in working in the context of global market transformation towards socially responsible and sustainable seafood supply chains. You are an entrepreneurial, innovative, energetic and socially and environmentally oriented person with at least 5 years of demonstrable working experience in a professional environment within the Mexican fisheries or ocean conservation sector. In addition to a preferably-international degree in environmental or social science, you should bring several years of professional experience in the private sector, either in Mexico or abroad.
